Wrestler code of conduct

1. All wrestlers will respect the property and equipment used at any sports facility, both home and away.
2. All wrestlers will encourage good sportsmanship through their actions by demonstrating positive support for all wrestlers, parents, coaches and officials at every match and practice.
3. All wrestlers will treat other wrestlers, coaches, officials, parents and spectators with respect.
 - a. **Throwing headgear and/or yelling at coaches/parents/officials during or following a match is disrespectful and puts the entire Becker wrestling program in a bad light. This behavior is not acceptable and will result in disciplinary action which may include suspension from the current or future team events.**
4. There will be no biting, scratching, punching, etc to other wrestlers, coaches, or parents. This conduct may lead to being asked to leave the program.

Consequences for violation of code of conduct will include 1 or more of the following:

1. Verbal warning
2. Written warning
3. Suspension from practice and team activities
4. Removal from wrestling program

** Consequences will be determined by the Coaches and BWBC board

Parents Code of conduct

1. Parents will encourage good sportsmanship through their actions and words, by demonstrating positive support for all wrestlers, parents, coaches and officials, at every tournament and practice.
2. Parents will promote the emotional and physical well being of all the wrestlers, ahead of any personal desire to win.
3. Parents need to remember that the matches are for the wrestlers and not for the parents to win or lose and will appreciate the efforts of all wrestlers and coaching staff.
4. Parents will treat all other parents, wrestlers, coaches, and officials with respect, regarding attitude, language and mannerisms.
5. Team events are coached by the coaches. Parents will remain in the spectator section and not attempt to help coach their child mat side unless requested by the coaches.
6. Cutting weight is not healthy and not encouraged or recommended by Becker youth wrestling. Parents are not to encourage wrestlers to cut weight. Eating healthy and exercising is not cutting weight.

Consequences for violation of code of conduct will include 1 or more of the following:

1. Verbal warning
2. Written warning
3. Suspension from practice and team activities
4. Removal from wrestling program
